- Courses will be offered in Berlin and in Schmalkalden as well.

- In total, 11 different courses (1 in Berlin, 5 per week in Schmalkalden) within the area of International Economics, International Business and Intercultural Management will be offered.
- Each 3-credit class is composed of three courses à 13 contact hours including three exams à 60 minutes.
- For 3 US credits students have to pass three courses successfully (three 60-minute exams), for 6 US credits six courses (six 60-minute exams).

Due to the wide range of 11 courses, which sum up to 143 contact hours, several courses have to be offered at the same time. It is possible to select up to 7 courses. The following table shows the four competing time slots and the three time slots, where only one class will be offered.

ISSS CULTURAL PROGRAMME 2024

Participation in the ISSS costs € 1,790 for three weeks. This fee INCLUDES:

- Lecture programme comprising all eleven courses
- Accommodation in Berlin (3-9 June in a hostel in downtown Berlin, multi-bed rooms) and Schmalkalden (9 June until 22 June in an apartment in downtown Schmalkalden, multi-bed rooms; 1 km / 0.6 miles away from the university), including breakfast; please, keep in your mind that arrival before Monday, 3 June, and departure after Saturday, 22 June, are at your own cost.

- Wall Museum at Checkpoint Charlie (most famous former US checkpoint),
- Sanssouci castles and gardens in Potsdam [UNESCO World Heritage Site].
- > River cruise, boat trip on a lake, flee market, shopping opportunities

Cultural Tours in Schmalkalden, Merkers, Erfurt, Weimar, Eisenach, Meiningen (9-22 June), all guided by the ISSS Team:

- > 1st open-air concert on campus (17 June)
- Schmalympics Opening Ceremony (18 June),
- > 2nd open-air concert on campus (18 June),
- > 3rd open-air concert on campus (19 June),
- > 4th open-air concert on campus (20 June),
- fireworks on campus by a professional pyrotechnician (20 June),
- > ISSS Ceremony and Graduation Ceremony, including barbecue (21 June),
- > 5th open-air concert on campus (21 June)

ISSS ARRIVAL

All ISSS students arrive at **BERLIN**. Monday, 3 June 2024, preferably between 3 and 7 p. m., should be the time of arrival at our hotel. If you arrive earlier, you can store your luggage at the reception, before you get your room in the early afternoon from 3 p.m. onwards. Our <u>hotel in</u> **Berlin** is a simple, old-fashioned (in traditional Berlin style) hotel in an excellent location, right in the heart of West-Berlin, only 100 metres (= 110 yards) away from Berlin's landmark "Kaiser-Wilhelm-Gedächtniskirche" (a half-destroyed church), surrounded by numerous restaurants, snack bars, cafés, shopping facilities, train stations (regional, local, subway) and bus stations:

Upper Room Hotel, Rankestraße 3, 10789 Berlin: www.upper-room-hotel.de.

The closest (100 metres = 110 yards away) subway station is: "Kurfürstendamm" (in short: "Ku'damm", West-Berlin's most famous boulevard). Try to travel light and make sure that you can carry your luggage by your own. Before you reach the elevator of the hotel you have to "climb" 2+17 stairs up and 2 stairs down 3.

The best connections to reach the hotel from Berlin's airport or from its central railway station are:

1) a) from Berlin airport BER:

Take an "RB" or "RE" train to "Zoologischer Garten" (around 40 minutes).

- b) from Berlin's <u>central railway station ("Berlin-Hauptbahnhof")</u>: Take an S-train (3, 5, 7 or 9) to "Zoologischer Garten" (around 6 minutes).
- 2) At "Zoologischer Garten", take the Eastern exit ("Ausgang Hardenbergplatz") and walk southwards (in total about 500 metres / 550 yards):
 - after having left the station at "Hardenbergplatz" turn right until you reach the traffic lights,
 - pass two traffic lights (1st straightforward, 2nd leftwards) so that you are passing the tallest building (hotel "Waldorf-Astoria") on your right-hand side,
 - pass the traffic lights at "Kantstraße" so that you are heading towards the church ruins,
 - **before** you reach the church turn right to the next traffic light close to the "H & M" store,
 - turn left for about 70 metres,
 - turn right into "Rankestraße", until you reach (after 100 metres / 110 yards) our "Upper Room Hotel" at number 3,
 - 2 + 17 steps up and 2 steps down and you reach the old-fashioned, but safe elevator; you find the reception on the 4th floor.

You might think you could save 400 metres of walking, if you take the subway from "Zoologischer Garten", in short: "Zoo station") to "Kurfürstendamm" (just 100 metres away from the hotel). However, you would not save many metres, because in this case, you have to walk to switch from the S-line to the U(nderground)-line.

Please, do <u>not</u> book any public transport (trains) in Germany now, because we try to find a way how you can get the "Germany Pass", which allows you unlimited travel within Germany within one month.

We all meet for our "Welcome Dinner" (you are invited) on

Monday, 3 June, 8:15 p.m., in the nearby restaurant "Peter Pane", Rankestraße 35, 10789 Berlin, (reservation under the name "ISSS").

When leaving our hotel cross the road and then turn left for 90 metres (100 yards), until you reach the restaurant on your right-hand side. If you are late, just join us later in the restaurant. If you are very late, check in your hotel (24-hour reception in the 4th floor) and meet the group next morning for breakfast.

On Sunday, 9 June, we will travel together by train to **<u>SCHMALKALDEN</u>** (about 360 km) and spend the rest of the time there.

While packing your luggage (travel light, what you bring you have to carry by your own (2), please, do not forget:

- * passport,
- * student ID card (take it always with you, discounts might be available),
- * health insurance voucher,
- * collapsible umbrella,
- * swimming trunks / swimsuit (a public swimming pool is next to our university campus),
- * sports shoes (if you like to participate in our "Schmalympic Games"),
- * insect repellent (might be useful during the "Midnight-Sun Lecture" in the forest).
