Content

On one hand, the lecture gives an overview of the laws which are applicable to international contracts, in particular to international contracts of sale of goods. The focus is on the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG – also called: Vienna Convention) which came into force in a total of 94 states. These include most European states, the USA, Australia, Brazil and the People's Republic of China. On the other hand, the lecture describes the different rules of arbitration and their procedures in practice.
