

Syllabus: “German as a Foreign Language A2.2”

(a) Inhalt und Ansatz | Content and Approach

- The course imparts knowledge of the German language in the areas of lexis, grammar, and phonetics and is oriented to the language competence level A2.1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
- Course content:
 - Working with different types of texts/reading and listening comprehension, vocabulary exercises, training in oral and written communication on topics such as public transport, directions, learning, exams, presentations, sporting events, living, moving, neighbors, time, free time, appointments, wishes, plans, music and art (e.g. picture description);
 - Grammatical structures such as verbs with dative and accusative, verbs with prepositions, alternating prepositions, subjunctive II (wishes, requests, advice, suggestions), indirect interrogative sentences: w-questions and yes/no questions with “ob”, subordinate clauses with “als” and “wenn” (temporal), sentences with “deshalb” and “trotzdem” (consecutive), relative clauses (nominative + accusative), location information, interrogative article, indefinite pronouns;
 - Exercises of listening comprehension as well as the expansion of vocabulary through intensive examination of current topics;
 - Speaking exercises connected to the topics of the course;
- The course is aimed at participants with German language skills at A2.1 level.
- The course takes place online.
- Regular attendance (at least 80% of all courses) is required for admission to the examination.
- With successful participation in the course, students acquire 5 ETCS points. Therefore, students should be prepared to spend a considerable time working with the study content.
- Registration on Stud.IP is required to participate in the course.
- The number of participants is limited.

(b) Qualifikationsziele | Learning Objectives

- The course focuses on communicative tasks aimed at improving written and oral expression in everyday situations.
- Participants are able to
 - understand sentences and frequently used expressions relevant in everyday life (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment).
 - communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters.
 - describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.
