

## Syllabus: “Introduction to German Studies”

### (a) Inhalt und Ansatz | Content and Approach

- The target group of the course consists of international students who have not been studying in Germany before and are therefore not yet familiar with living and/or studying in Germany. The course aims at introducing those students to the basics of German culture. The course uses Geert Hofstede’s six-dimension model of national culture as a framework for further investigation.
- Being designed as an academic introduction, the course work includes demanding academic reading, digital group work, research tasks and the submission of little projects. ### (b) Qualifikationsziele | Learning Objectives

- The qualification objectives of the course are (i) to gain basic knowledge on German history, political, societal and education systems based on its culture and being able to evaluate and weight arguments concerning recent discourses, (ii) to train key skills such as academic reading, presenting and writing, (iii) to raise the intercultural awareness in order to experience and pass their student stay in Germany as convenient and successful as possible.
