

Syllabus: "Introduction to European Studies"

International School, Wintersemester 2023 Dr. Marcus Hornung

(a) Inhalt und Ansatz | Content and Approach

- The target group of the course consists of either non-EU students, who have not been studying in Europe before, or EU students with an initial interest in European Studies. The course aims at introducing those students to the basics of researching the European Union, its constitutional bodies, history and functioning. It is based on the July 2020 speech by Chancellor Merkel to the European Parliament on the occasion of the Germany Presidency of the Council of the EU.
- Being designed as an academic introduction, the course work includes demanding academic reading, digital group work, research tasks and the submission of little projects. The course will be taught "blended", combining on-site and online sessions. Students require at least an advanced level of English to follow the lessons.
- For the successful completion of the course, the student will be awarded 3 ECTS. Therefore, students should be prepared to spend considerable time working with the study content.
- Participants are required to register for the course via <u>StudIP</u>, where all teaching resources will be made available. If there are problems with the registration via StudIP please contact Marcus Hornung via <u>marcus.hornung@gmx.de</u>.

(b) Qualifikationsziele | Learning Objectives

The qualification objectives of the course are (i) to gain basic knowledge on both Europe in general and
the EU in particular so that students will be enabled to evaluate and weight arguments concerning
recent discourses; (ii) to train key skills such as academic reading, presenting and writing; (iii) to raise
intercultural awareness in order to experience and pass their exchange semester as convenient and
successful as possible.
