<b>Content</b>	<p>The lecture gives an overview of the laws which are applicable to international contracts, in particular to international contracts of sale of goods. The focus is on the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG – also called: Vienna Convention) which came into force in a total of 94 states.
